1 Current Position

1.1 The current licensing hours for The Grumpy Mole at the Amato, Chalk Lane Hotel, Epsom, Surrey. KT18 7AS are as follows and attached as **Annex 3**:

Sale of Alcohol by Retail

Sunday to Wednesday 12.00 hours until 23.00 hours Thursday to Saturday 12.00 hours until midnight.

Provision of Regulated Entertainment:- Recorded Music; Provision of anything of a similar description to recorded music:

Sunday to Wednesday 12.00 hours until 23.00 hours Thursday to Saturday 12.00 hours until midnight.

The opening hours of the premises are as follows:

Sunday to Wednesday 12.00 hours until 23.00 hours Thursday to Saturday 12.00 hours until midnight

2 Introduction

- 2.1 Since the premises opened in 2017, the Licensing Authority has had considerable communications with both local residents and the premises with regard to general noise complaints and dispersal.
- 2.2 The applicants had pre-application discussions with Surrey Police and the Licensing Authority before the application was submitted.
- 2.3 The Variation Application is as follows and attached as **Annex 1**:

To add additional conditions to existing licence, namely

"[Out of respect for our neighbours] last orders for service in the garden will be 10pm. The garden will close with the lights off at 10.30pm. We will also display signage to this effect, including no ball games."

"We will also add additional signage which is visual to patrons leaving – Please respect our neighbours and leave quietly."

To add an additional thirty minutes drinking up time on all days.

To add Late Night Refreshment to the Premises Licence.

To add non-standard timings to Christmas Eve and New Years Eve.

To add the last orders for service in the garden will be 10pm with the garden closed and lights off at 10.30 pm.

3 Representations from Interested Parties

3.1 Three representations objecting to the application on the grounds of Public Nuisance and Public Safety have been received. These are attached as Annex 2

4 Representations from Responsible Authorities

4.1 No representations have been received from any Responsible Authorities.

5 Policy Considerations

5.1 A copy of the Statement of Licensing Policy adopted in December 2013 has been distributed to all parties. There are no Policy presumptions against the grant of the application however, Members will need to have due regard to the representations submitted and the location of the premises within Epsom and Ewell Borough Council.

5.2 The premises is in the Green Zone, there is policy presumption to grant the licence unless it can be shown that the application would undermine the licensing objectives.


Notes for Guidance

This application cannot be used to vary the licence so as to extend the period for which the licence has effect or to vary substantially the premises to which it relates. If you wish to make that type of change to the premises licence, you should make a new premises licence application under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

- 1. You do not have to pay a fee if the only purpose of the variation for which you are applying is to avoid becoming liable for the late night levy
- 2. Describe the premises. For example, the type of premises, its general situation and layout and any other information which could be relevant to the licensing objectives. Where your application includes off-supplies of alcohol and you intend to provide a place of consumption of these off-supplies of alcohol, you must include a description of where the place will be and its proximity to the premises.

 - Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
 - Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
 - Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
- 4. Where taking place in a building or other structure please tick as appropriate (indoors may include a tent).
- 5. For example state type of activity to be authorised, if not already stated, and give relevant further details, for example (but not exclusively) whether or not music will be amplified or unamplified.

We are writing to object against the application to vary the premise licence at The Grumpy Mole, The Amato, Chalk Lane; Epsom for the following reasons:

Prevention of Public Nuisance

We already experience noise from car engines, car doors slamming and people chatting very loudly late at night out the front of our property. The noise of people chatting, laughing and shouting also carries considerably from the pub garden as does the music being played. Patrons park across our drive on double yellow lines at busy times, making it very difficult for us to access it and they also leave rubbish on the curb side seemingly from emptying their cars.

Public Safety

We experience many Patrons driving the wrong way up the narrow one way street, at speed, to access the premises which is dangerous for all living in the vicinity but especially the elderly and children.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory Condition: where licence authorities supply of alcohol

Where a premise licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - (a) at a time when there is not designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Condition: exhibition of films

- 1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
- 2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection 3(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
- Where:
 - (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
 - (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question, Admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

Children means persons aged under 18; and Film classification body means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification)

Mandatory Condition: door supervision

- Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
 - 2. But nothing requires a condition to be imposed in respect of:
 - (a) paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
 - (b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).



Security activity means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and

Paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

Conditions 1, 2 and 3 below came into force on 6th April 2010, and 4 and 5 came into force on 1st October 2010 (as amended 1 October 2014).

- 1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—
 - (a)games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
 - (i)drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii)drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b)provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c)provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d)selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e)dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).



- **2.** The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a)a holographic mark, or (b)an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that—

(a)where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i)beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii)gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii)still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b)these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c)where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available."



The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions) Order 2014 came into force on May 2014.

A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—

"permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question;
- **3.** Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph)

not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the

price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.




Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating schedule


- 1. Installation of a comprehensive alarm system.
- 2. A fully operated CCTV (SANNCE) system recording all visitors to the establishment. It will be installed and operated and will give clear images of all persons arriving and exiting the premises. Access to images will be achievable within 24 hours. All CCTV images will be kept for at least seven days.
- 3. Five lever 'mortice locks', dead locks and bolts on all external doors.
- 4. Staff training will be recorded and updated every six months including H&S training; Management training; First Aid training.
- 5. When there are special events held at Epsom Race Course or other local venues, Dougal Inns will carry out a Risk Assessment with a view to employing SIA door staff.
- 6. Incident logs will be on the premises and kept up to date.
- 7. A Challenge 21 Policy will be adopted and appropriate signage will reflect that policy.
- 8. No alcohol will be sold for consumption off the property.
- 9. Signage will be displayed requesting that customers leave quietly and respect the neighbourhood.
- 10. A Challenge 21 will be operated at the premises. Forms of identification that will be accepted are a valid passport, photocard driving licence, HM Forces identity card and a PASS accredited identification card.
- 11. Signs will be placed in prominent positions at the entrance to the premises which explain no sales of alcohol to those underage and challenge 21 is in force.
- 12. A refusal log shall be maintained and be available on the premises.
- 13. We will have a policy on preventing harm to children to include documented staff training which will include the awareness of Child Sexual Exploitation and how to make a referral if any concerns are raised for children or any suspected perpetrator.
- 14. Signage will be prominently displayed warning customers of the legal penalties for purchasing alcohol for any person under the age of 18 years.
