## **Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions**

### **Mandatory Condition: where licence authorities supply of alcohol**

Where a premises licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
  - (a) at a time when there is not designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
  - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

### **Mandatory Condition: exhibition of films**

1. Where a premises licence authorises the exhibition of films, the licence must include a condition requiring the admission of children to the exhibition of any film to be restricted in accordance with this section.
2. Where the film classification body is specified in the licence, unless subsection 3(b) applies, admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that body.
3. Where:
  - (a) The film classification body is not specified in the licence, or
  - (b) The relevant licensing authority has notified the holder of the licence that this subsection applies to the film in question,  
Admission of children must be restricted in accordance with any recommendation made by that licensing authority.

Children means persons aged under 18; and

Film classification body means the person or persons designated as the authority under section 4 of the Video Recordings Act 1984 (c.39) (authority to determine suitability of video works for classification)

### **Mandatory Condition: door supervision**

1. Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity, the licence must include a condition that each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.
2. But nothing requires a condition to be imposed in respect of:
  - (a) paragraph 8(3)(a) of Schedule 2 to the Private Security Industry Act 2001 (c.12) (premises with premises licences authorising plays or films), or
  - (b) any occasion mentioned in paragraph 8(b) or (c) of that Schedule (premises being used exclusively by club with club premises certificate, under a temporary event notice authorising plays or films or under a gaming licence), any occasion within paragraph 8(3)(d) of that Schedule (occasions prescribed by regulations under that Act).

Security activity means an activity to which paragraph 2(1)(a) of that Schedule applies, and

Paragraph 8(5) of that Schedule (interpretation of references to an occasion) applies as it applies in relation to paragraph 8 of that Schedule.

**Conditions 1, 2 and 3 below came into force on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2010, and 4 and 5 came into force on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2010 (as amended 1 October 2014).**

1. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises—

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).

2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—

(a) a holographic mark, or

(b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. The responsible person must ensure that—

(a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—

(i) beer or cider: ½ pint;

(ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and

(iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;

(b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and

(c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.”

**The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions) Order 2014 came into force on May 2014.**

1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
  - (a) “duty” is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979(6);
  - (b) “permitted price” is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where—

- (i) P is the permitted price,
  - (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
  - (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
- (i) the holder of the premises licence,
  - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
  - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994(7).

3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph)

not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the

price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.  
(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule**

1. CCTV shall be installed and maintained in good working order.
2. All drinks shall be served in toughened glasses.
3. Patrons shall not be permitted to bring alcohol onto the premises, or take alcohol from the premises in open containers.
4. The number of persons permitted on the premises shall not exceed 80 seated or standing.
5. A proof of age scheme shall be implemented.
6. A personal licence holder shall be on the premises at all times alcohol is available for sale.
7. The premises shall be adequately lit when open to the public.
8. Free drinking water shall always be available to customers.
9. Recorded music shall only be played inside the premises.
10. All doors shall remain closed during entertainment events, accept for the entrance and exit of customers.
11. All windows shall remain closed during entertainment events.
12. Signage shall be provided in prominent positions requesting customers to leave the premises quietly with respect to local residents.
13. Noxious smells shall not be generated from the premises.
14. The consumption of alcohol outside the premises shall only be allowed within the tiled area at the front of the premises and shown in the Freehold as part of that property.
15. The operation of the premises must comply with all existing planning permission restrictions before the converted licence is to take effect.



### **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

1. Anyone who appears to be under the age of 25 years shall be requested to provide identification. Only photographic identification shall be accepted such as passport, driving licence or citizen cards with holograms. If a customer is unable to provide identification then no sale of alcohol shall be made.
2. The licence holder shall maintain a comprehensive digital colour CCTV system at the premises that ensures all public areas of the licensed premises are monitored, including all public entry and exit points and the street environment, and which shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and video recordings shall be available to an authorized officer or police officer together with facilities for viewing. The recordings for the preceding two days shall be made available immediately on request. Recordings outside this period shall be made available on 24 hours notice (subject to the requirements of the Data Protection Act 1998). Recordings will be maintained for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. The Police and Licensing Authority to be given access to monitor live performances at all times.
3. There shall be a minimum of two SIA registered door supervisors shall be on duty every Friday and Saturday night, and any night where there is live music, dance or, disco event between the hours of 21.00 and the terminal hour stated on the current licence.
4. All incidents involving door staff shall be recorded in a suitable log, including all refused entries. The log shall be made available for inspection on request to the police and local authority officers.
5. Toilets shall be checked every hour and a log kept of each check. The log shall be made available for inspection on request to the police and local authority officers.
