## **Quarterly Development Management Performance Update**

Statistics showing the Council's progress in meeting performance targets for 'Major', 'Minor' and 'Other' planning applications is shown below. The data is shown quarterly, as provided to the Department for Levelling Up, Housing & Communities, with the most recent Quarter 2 of 2022 (i.e. April/May/June) in bold and previous Quarters shown for information:

#### Major planning applications (target 60%):

The data shows that there has been a significant improvement in performance since the beginning of the year – this is largely as a result of the work done earlier this year (and ongoing) to clear the backlog of older 'out of time' planning applications.

The backlog of Major, Minor and Other planning applications currently sits at 91, a reduction of over 75% from the 383 out of time applications at the beginning of the year. The overall number of planning applications now determined 'in time' is increasing as the backlog of old applications decreases.
