Summary

Members are requested to determine an application to vary a premises licence where the authority has received relevant representation.

Recommendation (s)

The Sub-Committee is asked to:

Have regard to the relevant representations made during the consultation period, and to take such steps (if any) as it considers appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives. The steps are:

- (1) To grant the variation application as applied for.
- (2) Modify the conditions of the licence, altering or omitting or adding to them.
- (3) Reject the whole or part of the application.

1 Background

1.1 The supply of alcohol is a licensable activity under the Licensing Act 2003. Authorisation from the Council, in its role as the licensing authority, is required in order to carry on the activity at a premises within the borough.

- 1.2 Under the scheme of delegation adopted by the Council the Sub-Committee is responsible for the exercise of many of the functions of the Council as a licensing authority, including determination of applications where representations have been received.
- 1.3 The Council may dispense with holding a hearing if the licence holder and all persons who made valid representations agree that such a hearing is unnecessary and give notice to the authority to that effect.

2 Application

- 2.1 A premises licence authorises the sale of alcohol off the premises at Ruxley Food and Wine at 427 Kingston Road, West Ewell KT19 0BT for the following hours;-
 - Monday to Saturday 08.00 hours until 23.00 hours
 - Sunday 10.00 hours until 22.30 hours

A copy of the current premises licence is attached at Appendix 1

- 2.2 On 19 June 2025 K A Brothers Ltd ("the licence holder") applied for a variation to the premises licence to authorise the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises 24 hours a day, with the sales from 23:00 to 07:00 to be through a hatch/window. A copy of the application is attached at Appendix 2, and a copy of the plan of the premises provided is attached at Appendix 3.
- 2.3 All applications for variation of premises licences must be advertised by the display of a notice at the premises and by a public notice in the local newspaper. The licensing department has determined that this application complies with the public notice requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.4 A location plan showing the local area is attached at Appendix 4.

3 Representations from Interested Parties

3.1 No representations were received from members of the public.

4 Representations from Responsible Authorities

- 4.1 On 11 July 2025 the responsible authority for the police made representation. A copy of this representation is attached as Appendix 5.
- 4.2 On 17 July 2025 the responsible authority for environmental health made representation. A copy of this representation is attached as Appendix 6.

5 General principles to be followed

- 5.1 When determining applications, the Sub-Committee is required to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives, which are:
 - The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm
- 5.2 In determining applications, the Council must have regard to its statement of licensing policy, and to the statutory guidance issued under section 182 Licensing Act 2003.
- 5.3 If granted the licence would be subject to the mandatory conditions as attached at Appendix 7.
- 5.4 There are no conditions that would be added to the licence as a result of the operating schedule (section M of the application Appendix 2).

6 Policy Considerations

- 6.1 A copy of the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy (December 2018) has been sent to the licence holder and Responsible Authorities together with this report.
- 6.2 Section 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 stresses that in carrying out its functions, a licensing authority must "have regard to" guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182. This implies looking at the guidance, factoring in its relevance and/or weight, if any, as those matters appear to the licensing authority.
- 6.3 The Section 182 Guidance states with respect to the roles of Responsible Authorities;
 - '9.12 Each responsible authority will be an expert in their respective field, and in some cases it is likely that a particular responsible authority will be the licensing authority's main source of advice in relation to a particular licensing objective. For example, the police have a key role in managing the night-time economy and should have good working relationships with those operating in their local area. The police should usually therefore be the licensing authority's main source of advice on matters relating to the promotion of the crime and disorder licensing objective...However, it remains incumbent on all responsible authorities to ensure that their representations can withstand the scrutiny to which they would be subject at a hearing.'

7 Legal Implications

- 7.1 Decisions on licensing matters engage issues of human rights, in particular, Article 1 of the First Protocol, the peaceful enjoyment of possessions, Article 6, the right to a fair hearing, and Article 8, respect for private and family life. However, interference with Convention rights is permitted where lawful and necessary in the interests of public safety, the prevention of disorder or crime, the protection of health and morals or for the protection of the rights and freedoms of others.
- 7.2 Due regard must also be had to the public sector equality duty enshrined in Section 149 of the Equality Act 2010, which aims to eliminate unlawful discrimination, having regard to the nine protected characteristics. The nine protected characteristics are: age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex and sexual orientation.
- 7.3 All applications for new or varied Premises Licences or Club Premises Certificates must be advertised by the display of a notice at the premises and by a public notice in the local newspaper. Pursuant to the Council's constitution the Council's licensing department has determined that there is a valid application that complies with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 7.4 Licence holders may appeal to the magistrates' court if the licensing authority has rejected their application to vary a premises licence. If a licence is granted, the licence holder may appeal against the imposition of conditions on that licence, or the exclusion of a licensable activity. Those who made relevant representations during the course of an application may appeal against the decision to grant a licence.
- 7.5 Appeal to the magistrates' court who will hear the matter afresh and will only overturn a licensing authorities decision if it thinks it is wrong. This reinforces the importance of well drafted reasons for the decision as the magistrates court is more likely to uphold a well drafted set of reasons.

Legal Officer's comments:

7.6 When considering licence applications, the Sub-Committee shall carry out its functions with a view to promoting the licensing objectives. The licensing objectives are: Prevention of crime and disorder; Public Safety; Prevention of public nuisance; Protection of children from harm.

The Sub-Committee must ensure that all licensing decisions have: taken into account all relevant representations; a direct relationship to the promotion of one or more of the four licensing objectives; regard to the Council's statement of licensing policy; regard to the Secretary of State guidance; there must not be a blanket policy to the extent that it is applied so rigidly that an exercise of discretion in each individual case is precluded. Applications must be considered with regard to the principles of fair process and the Human Rights Act 1998.

When considering an application for the variation of an existing licence, only the variation is subject to determination. No changes can be made to a licence or conditions attached unless they are subject to the variation application.

The licence holder has the right of appeal against the decision made by the Sub-Committee to the Magistrates' Court within a period of 21 days beginning with the day that the licence holder is notified, in writing, of the decision.

Annex 1 – Mandatory conditions

Mandatory Condition: where licence authorities supply of alcohol

Where a premise licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - (a) at a time when there is not designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Conditions 1, 2 and 3 below came into force on 6th April 2010, and 4 and 5 came into force on 1st October 2010.

- 1.—(1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
- (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
- (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
- (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
- (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
- (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
- (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
- (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
- (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
- (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise antisocial behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
- 2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
- **3.** The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- **4**. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol. The Policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
- **5**. The responsible person shall ensure that were any of the following alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures -
 - 1, Beer or cider ½ pint;
 - 2. Gin, rum, vodka or whisky 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - 3. Still wine in a glass 125 ml; and
 - b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures

Please note that Conditions 1 and 2 do not apply to premises licences where it authorizes only the sale by retail off the premises

Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the operating schedule

Use of CCTV, with the retention of tapes for a minimum of period of 31 days for prosecution purposes

Operate a challenge 21 policy to ensure that liquor is sold only to persons of lawful age. Whereby any person not looking the age of 21 must prove that they are in fact over 18 for the purposes of the sale of alcohol. Acceptable forms of identification concerning the issue of age are the Portman Card, Citizen Card or ten year passport.

Staff undergo training concerning knowledge of Licensing Laws together with social impact upon the sale of alcohol

Operate a due diligence policy, incorporating the challenge 21 policy, full training for all staff, the operation of a refusal book and refresher training on a regular basis.

Prominent signage located throughout the store confirming the legal minimum age for the purchase of alcohol.





Surrey Police received the application to fully vary the current licence held at 427 Kingston Road, Epsom, KT18 OBT on 19th June 2025. The premises is seeking the following:

- Extension of opening hours and licensable hours:
 - Monday to Sunday 00:00 00:00
- The addition of delivery services. Delivery will be through 3rd parties.
- The use of a window hatch for sales between 23:00 07:00

Surrey Police have fully considered all Licensing Objectives and have found that the variation will undermine these Objectives, Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety, and the Prevention of Public nuisance.

Police have concerns that the opening of a premises selling alcohol 24-hours a day at the location will increase the likelihood of crime - including but not limited to Anti-Social Behaviour, Public Order offences and Drunk and Disorderly Behaviour. The surrounding area is quite heavily residential, and the increased hours will bring people on to the streets causing noise issues and potential street drinking. Delivery vehicles will also cause noise nuisance for the residents.

There is a lack of security information or protocols on how a lone worker would remain safe whilst working in the premises. There is a major concern that this variation would open the premises to a higher risk than normal of targeted criminal behaviour. There are no other premises in the area that sell alcohol 24 hours a day and this premises is not situated a late-night economy area.

Delivery of alcohol 24/7 via third party delivery services will have an impact on other areas of the Borough. Epsom Town Centre is already a part of the Borough where Police have had to undertake targeted operations to reduce Nighttime Economy violence and ASB. The latest premises in the Town Centre closes at 03:00. Police want to encourage persons to leave the area and return home once all premises are closed. There is a concern that people could order more alcohol and potentially street drink in the area, and this will have a significant impact on the invaluable good that work the Epsom Town Centre premises and licensees have already undertaken. There is nothing to prevent persons ordering from this premises to deliver to nonresidential or business places.

Police believe that the variation of licence should not be granted as there is the potential to seriously undermine the licensing objectives. However, should the sub-committee feel it appropriate to grant the licence, Police request that the sub-committee respectfully consider a reduction in hours so that the premises does not remain open 24 hours a day and further conditions to be added.

Sunday 09:00 - 23:30

An application has been received to vary the current licence held at 427 Kingston Road, Epsom, KT18 0BT on 19th June 2025. The premises is seeking the following:

- Extension of opening hours and licensable hours:
 - o Monday to Sunday 00:00 00:00
- The addition of delivery services. Delivery will be through 3rd parties.
- The use of a window hatch for sales between 23:00 07:00

I am concerned that the application to extend hours will have an impact locally by generating issues relating to nuisance and safety. The following relates points relate to the application:

- Increase in activity and noise
 - The local area is made up of parades of shops with residential flats above. The units above the commercial units are residential flats, which are in occupation and provide homes to many families. The further surrounding area is made up of larger family houses, and the increased hours will bring more traffic of people and vehicles (at antisocial times) to the area. There is the potential for the residence directly adjacent, above and opposite the shop will be disturbed throughout the night by the activity of the selling of the alcohol. The likelihood of people parking and idling around the premises will increase as they purchase from the window. These are all going to impact on the quiet enjoyment of the residents. The delivery coming and going will also be disturbing to the residential units as they move up and down the kerbs to get close to the collection window.
- Nighttime economy

There is currently no nighttime economy on the parades of shops that operate beyond 11pm. The allowance of this property to operate after 11 pm will give a reason for more traffic to be in the area beyond 11pm and this will begin to change the make-up of this predominantly residential area.

Lone Worker

The person employed to operate the windowed shop after 23:00 is more at risk by being in this isolated area. The shop will need to carry out a risk assessment for the employee and also provide additional training to ensure the sale of the alcohol is well managed. Consideration needs to be given to being able to clearly see customers to ensure the person purchasing the goods are of appropriate age and in suitable state (le not under the influence). The vulnerability of this employee is greater than a daytime shop operator.

Environmental Health do not believe the changes to the licence occur as there will be an impact on the local residential population. Should the sub-committee feel it appropriate to grant the licence, we ask that the sub-committee considers a reduction in hours so that the premises does not remain open 24 hours a day and further conditions to be added.

<u>Hours of Licensable Activity:</u> Monday to Saturday 08:00 – 00:00 Sunday 09:00 – 23:30

Additional Conditions: (current conditions on Premises Licence to remain)

- No mounting of the footpaths of delivery vehicles
- All delivery drivers to cut off engines when collecting deliveries. No idling
- Signage to be displayed requesting customers interact with the shop in a quiet manner, that customers leave quietly and respect the neighbourhood. This is to be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Mandatory Condition: where licence authorities supply of alcohol

Where a premise licence authorises the supply of alcohol, the licence must include the following conditions

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence
 - (a) at a time when there is not designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
 - (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Condition came into force on 6th April 2010 (as amended 1 October 2014).

- 3. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either—
 - (a)a holographic mark, or
 - (b)an ultraviolet feature.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Conditions) Order 2014 came into force on May 2014.

- 4. **1.** A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
 - **2.** For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1—
 - (a)"duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula—

$$P = D + (DxV)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,
- (ii) D is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence—
 - (i) the holder of the premises ligence,43

- (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a spenda Item 3 Appendix 7 (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence:
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.
- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.
