

How we help – adult carers

- Face-to-face and telephone support for information, advice and signposting
- Drop in 'Hubs' across the county where carers can come for help and support
- A wide range of events (on Zoom and face to face), from learning, training and information, to wellbeing and relaxation, giving time out from caring
- Support Groups, both online and face to face, with groups for all carers, plus some specialist groups too, e.g. parent carers or dementia carers
- Benefits advice on what you might be entitled to as an unpaid carer
- A dedicated Moving & Handling team, giving advice and training on helping to move someone safely, and use equipment
- Carer Advisors to in Surrey's main hospitals
- Advocacy and information carers' rights
- A wealth of free resources, including regular newsletters, booklets, email updates and ww.actionforcarers.org.uk









How we help – younger carers

Our Surrey Young Carers team gives free support to young carers aged between 5 and 17.

- We run drop-ins, forums, activities and groups and give these vulnerable young people support, information, and crucially time out from their caring role.
- We also help Surrey's schools identify and support young carers.
- We also run some specialist events, and have targeted information, for young adult carers aged 18-25, who face unique challenges as they look to move on with their lives.
