1 Reason for Recommendation

 - 2.2.2 **Urgency reason for decision 146** The next S&R committee was 28th January 2025 which was considered to be too late to ensure distribution and complete spend as required by end March 2025. A decision taken then enabled the distribution of funds in a timely manner to minimise the risk of underspend and the need to return funds. Officers needed to commence work immediately and allocate these funds as to ensure full spend. A decision was therefore needed prior to the next scheduled S&R committee.
