New Funding Package Payment Profile

Implementation date 1 March 2025 (version 1.1)



Overview

The previous ACRS & ARAP funding included separate tariffs for integration; health: ESOL; education; and flexible housing fund. Not all households were eliaible for all elements, which made it complex to claim and administer. Funding for integration, housing and homelessness has been consolidated into a single streamlined flexible tariff. This package gives LAs freedom to prioritise resources.

The new funding package will be implemented from 1 March 2025 and apply to those in transitional accommodation and to all new arrivals.

Those already in settled accommodation and supported by LAs will remain on the current integration tariff.

Set out here is the total funding package for LAs; the exceptional costs mechanism will continue*. No other funding is available.

Integration Tariff details - £24,110 per person total over 3 years

This is funding to support Eligible Persons (Eps) resettled through ARP to integrate into British Society and become self-sufficient more quickly in the early years. This tariff can be pooled and used flexibly to deliver the statement of outcomes. A funded settled accommodation pipeline will provide homes for around half of the arrivals home. Accommodation matching will be focused on those identified as hardest to house.

Single payment, one-off payment. Healthcare Funding Instructions and guidance will be published at the same time as the late gration Funding.

with Ived **Education Tariff details:** up to £5,130 per child aged 5-18 and up to £2,965 per child aged 3-4 Available in first year only. The education tariff will be split into three proportional payments aligned with the three-year 1 integration tariff payments:

Year 1

Three payments up to £12,410 per person: **Payment 1** - £5,400 per person; available to be

claimed by the LA hosting transitional accommodation or LA providing settled housing upon arrival. Enables LAs to provide immediate support, including casework support for those in transitional accommodation.

Payment 2 - £3,600 pp (month 4-9): claimable by transitional or settled LA for support into settled housing. To be paid to transitional LA if guests are to remain in transitional accommodation between 4 and 9 months or to the settled LA if guests have moved into settled accommodation.

Payment 3 - £3,410 pp (month 10): claimable by settled LA or the LA providing homelessness support. A payment to a settled LA or payment for the LA providing homelessness support if different from the transitional accommodation LA.

Healthcare funding in year 1 will consist of one payment claimed by the Integration Care Boards (England) or Health Boards (Scotland, Wales and NI). This funding can be claimed by either the Board providing support in transitional accommodation or settled accommodation, whichever a household arrives in first. Funding can only be claimed once per person.

Payment 1 - £2,600 per person

Funding in year 1 will consist of three proportional payments:

Payment 1 – £2,257.20 child (5-18 years) and £1,304.60 per child (3-4 years): available to be claimed by the LA hosting transitional accommodation or settled housing upon arrival.

Payment 2 – £1,487.70 child (5-18 years) and £859.85 per child (3-4 years): claimable by transitional or settled LA for support into settled housing.

Payment 3 – £1,385.10 child (5-18 years) and £800.55 per child (3-4 years): claimable by settled LA or the LA providing homelessness support.
